Luke 6.47


### MENTAL HEALTH & WELL BEING: Generation C

A couple of weeks ago Mrs R asked the staff to watch a webinar led by Jaz Ampaw-Farr (a wellbeing/life coach). She was talking about children as Generation C(Covid 19). She questioned what the C could stand for: compassion? courage? creativity? chaos fighter?

As we welcomed some of our Reception children back – I was feeling anxious and a bit sad.
