### **GETTING READY FOR NEXT YEAR & SCHOOL REPORTS**

Your child's reports will be emailed to you on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> July. In preparation for next year, the children will be able to access clips from their teachers on eschools. There will be some question and answer sessions as well as meeting teachers and finding out a bit about them. During the last two weeks of term, teachers will be introducing themselves to their new classes and give a virtual tour of their classrooms, ready for the children's return to school in September.

If your children are in school over the next fortnight class teachers will aim to meet their new children for September during Wild Woodland Learning sessions or outdoor play sessions. We hope this will help to settle any uncertainties about next year.

## **HOME LEARNING**

Many thanks to all the parents who took the time to send us feedback on the online learning. We have an action plan in place and are already beginning to make tweaks to our practice in order to better support you and your children. Firstly, you will see and hear teachers ~ we're trying to get the teacher voice into the learning packages. We are also planning a Class 2,3 & 4 project on castles for the last 2 weeks which means families can work on similar tasks together. Across the summer I will be working with Heads from across the Trust to develop the use of TEAMS as a learning platform which we aim to begin using in September. So, there's lots to keep us busy!

### **WELCOME BACK**

  hands, apply sanitizer and sit at named desk (monitored by class TA). Parents will be
  required to queue roadside/carpark side, on the social distance lines provided when
  dropping children to school.
- Y2 pupils to arrive at 9:10, enter school via pathway to playground. To be met by
  class teacher at the school gate by the road and directed to go to wash hands, apply
  sanitizer and sit at named desk (monitored by class TA). Parents will be required to
  queue roadside/carpark side, on the social distance lines provided when dropping
  children to school.
- EYFS pupils to arrive at 9:30. to continue with current drop off & pick up routines already established

# Staggered end to each day week beginning 6th July

- 3:00 pm EYFS children to be collected from gate at the front of school.
- 3:15 pm Y2 children to be collected from front gate where they were dropped off ~ teachers will line children up and bring them to the gate.
- 3:30 pm Y4 children to be collected from church path gate~ teachers will line children up and bring them to the gate.
- Key worker / EHCP children may be collected until 4:00pm from the school office where they will be signed out.

## Staggered start to each day: week beginning 13<sup>th</sup> July

- Key worker / EHCP children to start school between 8:00 & 8:30, enter school via school office, as current practice.
- Y5 pupils to arrive at 8:45, enter school via pathway to playground. To be met by
  class teacher at the school gate by the road and directed to go to wash hands, apply
  sanitizer and sit at named desk (monitored by class TA). Parents will be required to
  queue roadside/carpark side, on the social distance lines provided when dropping
  children to school.
- Y3 pupils to arrive at 9:10, enter school via pathway to playground. To be met by
  class teacher at the school gate by the road and directed to go to wash hands, apply
  sanitizer and sit at named desk (monitored by class TA). Parents will be required to
  queue roadside/carpark side, on the social distance lines provided when dropping
  children to school.
- EYFS pupils to arrive at 9:30. to continue with current drop off & pick up routines already established

## Staggered end to each day week beginning 13th July

- 3:00 pm EYFS children to be collected from gate at the front of school.
- 3:15 pm Y3 children to be collected from front gate where they were dropped off ~ teachers will line children up and bring them to the gate.
- 3:30 pm Y5 children to be collected from church path gate~ teachers will line children up and bring them to the gate.
- Key worker / EHCP children may be collected until 4:00pm from the school office
  where they will be signed out.
   It will be lovely to see more of our children in school and we will ensure that they will

be given time plenty of for wellbeing activities, social catch ups and fun! Of course, we will do some learning too!

### **WELLBEING**

Our Mindfulness activity is very much linked to saying goodbye to Year 6 today and is for pupils changing class next year: 'Everything Changes' ... What is the flow of Life?



- 1. Have you ever noticed that things change every day, like the weather? Perhaps a tree has a new bud or a flower has wilted.

- 4. Write, draw or tell someone how you feel about these changes.
