PE, TRAINERS & KIT IN GENERAL

The start of the new year is a good time to remind you that children do need "proper" kit for PE lessons. Please would you check that your child does have the correct kit and that it is in school every week, all week, from Monday to Friday. The correct kit varies according to age but certainly includes shorts, t-shirts and trainers supplemented by jogging bottoms and warmer tops for when the weather gets cooler (all named please). If this kit is in school, in a smallish bag it creates a "fail safe" situation that allows weather related changes to be accommodated when required.

You may be aware of the government initiative to ensure all children have daily physical activity; with this in mind, the staff have designed a variety of activities, which will certainly get the heart rates up! These activities are in addition to our 2 hours of weekly PE lessons. We will need your help to make sure all children have their trainers in school every day. Thank you.

Reception children arrive through the main front door~ this enables us to keep the front gate locked and all our little people in school! Every school day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning. Attendance percentages can be misleading. If we took a maths test 90% would be great; but do you know what it really means when looking at attendance?
