In a world where we are all have busy lives, it is so important to stop and take notice of our surroundings, to just 'be'. To appreciate our environment, to use all of our senses to do this. Ask questions when out on walks, visits to the seaside etc: what can you hear/see/smell? Notice the 'extraordinary in the ordinary', help your child to feel thankful. Gratitude is such an important part of our wellbeing.

Encourage your child to notice their feelings and support them to process their emotions in a positive way!

'Being able to recognise emotions and moods helps us to become more comfortable with them and develop strategies to deal with them. It helps us to be able to 'tune in' to what they are telling us and be able to 'unbox' emotions as we move through our day.'
