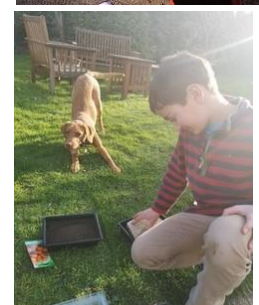
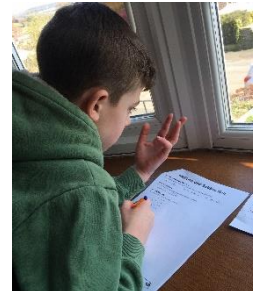

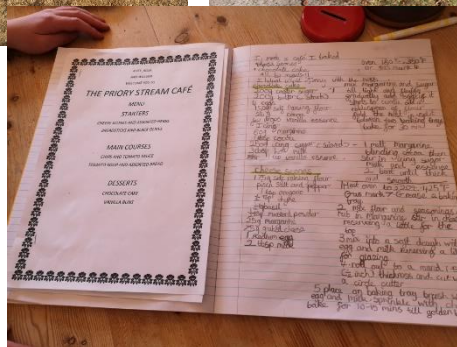
Clearly the Egyptian topic in class 3 has inspired children ~ Vida has mummified a tomato!
