Dear Parents,


Welcome back to the Spring term! I can hardly believe the holidays are over and we are back into the swing of school life. Another busy and exciting term lies ahead.

### LANDSCORE LEARNERS

In their Personal, Social and Emotional Development learning, **Class One** discussed why we have rules, such as our school rules, home rules and other rules. After talking about the rules of different games, they played them. As they did so, we discussed how the rules helped us play these games.




**Class 2** have loved learning a new skill - how to use dictionaries! They chose words from their class book and worked in pairs to look up their meanings. After finding the definitions, the children drew pictures to represent the words and then we challenged ourselves to use each one correctly in a sentence. It was lovely to see such great teamwork and thoughtful discussions about new vocabulary!



In computing, **Class 3** have learnt that text and layout can be edited to communicate more clearly. They explored how changing font style, size and colour can be used for different purposes, and practised editing text to improve clarity. The class had great discussions about how presentation can help a message make sense!



Working from a photograph of St Matthew's Church, **Class Four** used their observational skills to make some initial sketches. They focused on drawing the outline shapes, ensuring accurate representation of proportions, before adding details.



## A GENTLE REMINDER


## ETHOS, VISION & VALUES
