LANDSCOPE LEARNERS



CLASS 1's focus in PE is team work. After warming up with a game of tag, the children had to work collaboratively in teams to create a person from PE equipment. There was some great listening, sharing of ideas and even some compromise to ensure everyone had input into the finished pieces.

The children have also used their listening skills and teamwork to play our parachute games. They had to stretch up high and bend down low to keep the parachute moving. Fruit salad was great fun, but the favourite game was creating a giant tent with all of us sitting under it!



CLASS 2 became young scientists as we investigated an important question: Do woodlice prefer damp or dry conditions? The children showed fantastic observation skills, carefully watching the woodlice and thinking about their behaviour. They also practised collecting data using tally charts, helping them record their findings like real researchers.

A big thank you to all the parent volunteers who supported us during the activity — your help made a real difference.

After completing our investigation, we made sure to take care of our tiny subjects by safely releasing the woodlice back into the bug hotel.



CLASS 3 During our science lesson, Class Three investigated a range of materials to identify which are good electrical conductors and good electrical insulators.

R - Responsibility. E - Empathy and respect. P - Perception of risk. A – Adaptability and resilience. R - Regulation. E - Executive functioning. D - Digital discernment.
