Parking

I have been asked to raise this with you as this is a topic causing real concern for many parents is parking. We are lucky to have a car park ~ something most village schools must cope without.

I have been asked to remind you all about the importance of parking responsibly in the car park – especially at the beginning and end of each day.

It has been brought to our attention that the yellow hatched area at the top of the car park is being used as free parking space. Cars should never park in this area as it is designed to allow safe access to the car park for the children and any emergency vehicles if they were ever required. Please do not park here in future.

We have a disabled bay, which is for disabled drivers only and spaces for the taxis in front of the bins. Don't forget we have the village hall car park just down the road and a permissible pathway which takes you from the village green right up to our school field ~ when the weather is kind, it's a lovely stroll. I know many of you lift share, which is great as it cuts down on the vehicles needing the spaces. It feels like I've just given a lot of 'reminders' but I'm sure that you will understand that we need to make the area around school as safe as possible for yourselves as parents and your children.
