
LANDSCOVE LEARNERS

PARKING

Our School Ethos Group has raised Parking as a topic causing real concern for many parents.

I have been asked to remind you all about the importance of parking responsibly in the car park – especially at the beginning and end of each day.

It has been brought to our attention that the yellow hatched area at the top of the car park is being used as free parking space. Cars should never park in this area as it is designed to allow safe access to the car park for the children and any emergency vehicles if they were ever required. Please do not park here in future.



It is also evident that many parents park at the entrance of the car park against the hedge. It's really not the safest place to stop, so please do not use this as a parking bay.

We have a disabled bay, which is for disabled drivers only and spaces for the taxis in front of the bins. Don't forget we have the village hall car park just down the road and a permissible pathway which takes you from the village green right up to our school field ~ when the weather is kind, it's a lovely stroll. I know many of you lift share, which is great as it cuts down on the vehicles needing the spaces. I'm sure that you will understand that we need to make the area around school as safe as possible for yourselves as parents and your children.


If your child is not going to be in school, please ensure you call or email the office to let us know. All registers need to be complete by 9:30 at the latest with correct information to explain absences.

COVID

As you will be aware we have had a run of COVID in school. The following is the DFE advice we use. Please follow this to know when your child/ren should return to school.

Attendance:	
(Our school target is 97%)	
Whole school	78.5%
Class 1	92.2%
Class 2	77.8%
Class 3	84.6%
Class 4	68.1%
Well done to class 2!	

Examples of when to end self-isolation if you have had COVID-19 symptoms or have received a positive COVID-19 test result



The day you get your test result is day 0 Children then isolate for 5 days. (After day 0)

When to stop self-isolating

You can do a rapid lateral flow test from day 5 of your self-isolation period (but not before) and another test the next day(these should be 24 hours apart).

You can stop self-isolating if:

- both tests are negative
- you do not have a high temperature

If you have a high temperature, continue to isolate

You can stop self-isolating after the 10 days if either:

- you do not have any symptoms
- you just have a cough or changes to your sense of smell or taste these can last for weeks after the infection has gone.

You do not need to do any more rapid lateral flow tests after day 10 of your self-isolation period.

When to keep self-isolating after 10 days

If you have a high temperature after the 10 days, or are feeling unwell, keep self-isolati
